Candidates should have completed a PhD in Sociology or closely-related discipline by the appointment date. The successful candidate will contribute to a dynamic teaching and research culture in the Department and show evidence of a developing research program. We seek a candidate whose research or teaching interests lie in Social Theory and whose substantive area(s) of specialization will enhance the department's research and teaching strengths.

The Sociology Department is distinguished by its three areas of focus: knowledge and power, social justice, and the Sociology of everyday life. We emphasize a commitment to public Sociology and transformative practices. Our vibrant undergraduate and graduate programs offer students opportunities to research a diverse range of social issues.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach a range of Social Theory at the introductory, upper, and graduate levels and be able to supervise Honours and Graduate students.
