Qualifications: Candidates should have completed a PhD in Sociology (or closely related discipline) by the appointment date. The successful candidate will contribute to a dynamic teaching and research culture in the Department and show evidence of a developing research program. We seek a candidate whose research and teaching interests lie in the field of Race and/or Indigeneity and whose substantive area(s) of specialization will augment the department's research and teaching strengths.
