Candidates should have completed a PhD in History or relevant discipline by the appointment date and show evidence of a developing research program. The successful candidate must demonstrate a record of teaching excellence and student engagement at the undergraduate level. The successful candidate will develop courses in East Asian history and show an ability to connect with interdisciplinary courses at Acadia, including courses dealing with issues of social justice, international relations and/or law, environmental and health studies, including the history of medicine. The candidate should be able to perpetuate the department's contribution to a wide range of course offerings in the multi-disciplinary minors, for example: WGST, Legal Studies, Comparative Religions, Diaspora Studies, IDST, and the Health Sciences option.

The application must include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, confirmation of a terminal degree, a sample of scholarly writing, and teaching dossier.
