National Occupational Classification

NOC Skill Level	Description	Examples of Positions
NOC 0	HIGH-SKILLED Management jobs	Senior & middle management occupations
NOC A	HIGH-SKILLED Professional jobs * usually university	Registered Nurses, Accountants, HR professionals, Engineers, IT professionals, Doctors, Lawyers
NOC B	HIGH SKILLED Technical jobs and Skilled Trades * usually college / apprenticeship	Licensed Practical Nurses, Food Service Supervisors, Cooks, Electricians, Carpenters, Mechanics, Bookkeepers
NOC C	INTERMEDIATE SKILLED Semi-skilled jobs *usually secondary school / vocational	Continuing care assistants, Customer service representatives, Long-haul truck drivers, Food & beverage servers, General farm workers, Fish plant workers
NOC D	LOW SKILLED Entry level *on the job training	Food counter attendants & food preparers, Trades helpers & labourers, Light duty cleaners, Cashiers, Fish plant labourers

 - NOC 0, A, B
 - NOC C requires 6 months experience with Nova Scotia employer
 - NOC D ineligible if on post-grad work permit (PGWP)
- 1 year of paid work experience related to job offer
 can be experience earned back home or during your studies
- Age 21 to 55
- High school certificate
- English or French language ability
- Funds to pay fees and living expenses
- Intention to settle in Nova Scotia
- Legal status if in Canada

- Permanent full-time NOC C job offer from Nova Scotia employer
 - Truck Driver or Continuing Care Assistant

- Funds to pay fees and living expenses
- Intention to settle in Nova Scotia
- Legal status if in Canada



- Express Entry profile
- No job offer required
- 1 year of skilled work experience (NOC 0, A, B) in Nova Scotia
- Work experience gained AFTER graduation
- Age 21 to 55
- At least Canadian high school equivalent
- Minimum language test scores
- Intention to settle in Nova Scotia
- Legal status if in Canada







NSNP International Graduate Entrepreneur

- Started/bought a Nova Scotia business (at least 33% ownership)
- Age 21 or more
- Graduated from a Nova Scotia university or Nova Scotia Community College
- Operated the business for at least 1 year
- Viable business with 1 full-time employee
- Minimum language test scores
- Intention to settle in Nova Scotia



- Full-time permanent job offer (NOC 0, A ,B, C)
- 1 year work experience (NOC C)
- Minimum high school
- Minimum language: CLB 4

- No work experience
- 2-year post-secondary diploma from publiclyfunded school in Atlantic

Atlantic Immigration Pilot International Graduate Program

- Full-time permanent / 1-year contract job offer from a designated employer in Nova Scotia (NOC 0, A, B or C)
- Minimum 2-year degree, diploma or certificate from a recognized publicly-funded institution in Atlantic Canada
- Must have been a full-time student for duration of studies
- Graduated from the institution in the 24 months before PR application is submitted to federal immigration under AIP
- Lived in Atlantic Canada for at least 16 months prior to getting education credential
- Minimum language test scores CLB 4
