

50th Anniversary Meeting of the Class of 1972 Sunday, October 16, 2022 Draft Minutes

The 50th Anniversary meeting of the Class of 1972 was held on Sunday, October 16, 2022, at 12:00 pm in the Acadia Room, Upper Level of the K.C. Irving Environmental Science Centre, Acadia University, Wolfville, NS.

1. Welcome & Introductory Remarks

- Frank welcomed attendees to our 50th Anniversary meeting. As a first order of business, Frank read aloud the list of names of our classmates who have passed away since our graduation in 1972. He also referred to the List of Class Members who are coded in the University's system as "inactive" due to outdated contact information and with whom the University would like to reestablish contact.
- Following our last Class Meeting in 2017, Frank solicited Class Members on their preferred colour scheme for our Class Banner and for approval of the proposed Class Motto: "est Sapientia ab Scientia" which translates to "with Knowledge comes Wisdom" to be included on the bottom of the Banner. Based on the feedback Frank received at that time, he had the preferred Banner colour scheme made (with our Class Motto included) and "unveiled" it during this meeting. (Following the meeting, those present gathered around the Banner for a group picture.)
- Our Class Yell, jointly composed by Margaret MacDonald and Gail (Stagg) May in 2012, was adopted at our 2017 Class Meeting. For reference, a copy of the Yell is included in Appendix A of these minutes. At this meeting, Margaret noted that she had also composed a Class of '72 Poem and Acrostic for consideration at our next Class meeting Appendix B.

2. Approval of Minutes

3. Presentation of the 1972 Class Giving Report

- Nancy Handrigan ('92), Vice-President Advancement (Interim) at Acadia, was welcomed to the meeting to present the "1972 Class Giving Report." Before beginning her report, Nancy noted that she had previously served as Campaign Director for the University's last Capital Campaign, which had raised \$86.6 million for the University.
- Nancy noted that if Class members are not getting monthly emails from the Office of Advancement, to contact our Alumni Office <u>acadia.alumni@acadiau.ca</u> to get on the list and to stay subscribed. Nancy also referred to the list of Class Members for whom the University does not have current contact information.
- To date, our Class cumulative giving in all designations is \$645,357 in receipted donations.
- With respect to Giving in the 2022 Fiscal Year, no donations were designated to the Susan Smith Memorial Scholarship, which has an endowment of \$46,771. The Class of 1972 Memorial Scholarship is now endowed and currently sits at \$28,027 with donations totalling \$530 received during the 2022 Fiscal Year. A further \$30,706 was donated by Class members to other designations within the University during Fiscal 2022. Total Class giving for Fiscal 2022 totaled \$31,236.
- Since our last reunion five years ago, Nancy noted that the University received 285 donations from 60 donors.
- Only the interest on investments is used for scholarship commitments. The University Investment Committee approves the payouts. Frank suggested that if donations from our Class are not specified that they be directed to the Class of 1972 Memorial Scholarship so it can be awarded.
- Nancy noted that Frank is copied on letters to scholarship/award recipients pertaining to our Class. Frank asked that the previous scholarship awards from our Class be sent to Class members with the Minutes. So far, those Awards would be from the Susan Smith Fund. Nancy indicated that the first award from the Class Memorial Fund would be awarded this year.

4. New Business

- Meeting participants spent time reviewing the "Where Are They Now?" list to see how many "lost" Classmates were known personally and to encourage them to re-establish contact with the University. - Frank asked that Al Whittle's name be added to our Class "Deceased List" as Al was an Honorary Member of our Class.
